

3,000 cops deployed for Makar Sankranti

Cock fight under vigil

Administration is all set for a peaceful Makar Sankranti with elaborate security arrangements. The district police have deployed more than 3,000 police force along with around 200 women cops at different places during Makar Sankranti and Tusu festival at different places of the city on January 15.

East Singhbhum SSP Anoop Bihary said that they are deploying large number of police personnel at Domuhani which would witness a fair and also along the river banks. All the thana OCs have been directed to increase vigil along approach roads to major ghats and also to picnic spots as people will also throng picnic spots.

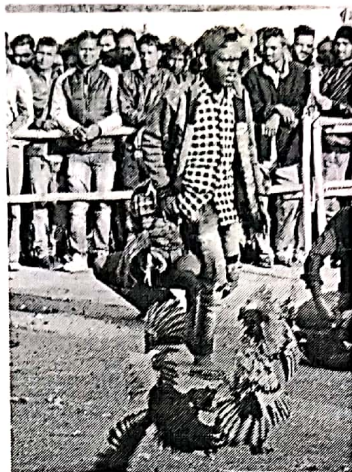
Significantly, fairs would be organised to mark Tusu festival at Domuhani (the largest fair in the region),

Bhillaipahari, Ghaghdihi, Parsadih and even in Ghatshila drawing thousands of tribals on Wednesday.

Special vigil would also be held at crowded places which witness cockfights to avoid any law and order situation. For those office going professionals who avoid street food and prefer to binge at eateries inside the market areas will have to compromise.

The tribals in and around the city are gearing up to celebrate Tusu, the harvest festival, with traditional fanfare and gaiety. Various social and cultural organisations are set to organise Tusu Mahotsav at places like Domuhani, Sonari (the meeting point of Subarnarekha and Kharkai) and Itagarh.

Hundreds of people, especially tribals, would assemble there to take part in the annual celebrations. Various tribal groups would carry the idol of



Goddess Tusu for immersion. The mela at Sonari, one of the oldest in the city, draws the maximum crowd. It is famous for organising traditional events with festivities.

"Melas are a traditional part of Tusu. It is organised with an aim to bring the traditional tribal culture and tribal artisans to the limelight. We have also planned a number of contests during the mela," said an official, organising committee, Tusu Mela Samiti, Itagarh.

The annual Tusu mela at Gopal Maidan also turns out to be a jamboree of tribal artists and performers not only from Jharkhand but also from neighbouring states like Odisha and Bengal.

People start flocking in groups from the morning carrying their Tusu idols and the choulda. The annual mela that is organised by Jharkhand Ekta Manch at Gopal Maidan is also one of the most sought after fair. People from different places came to the Tusu mela in large numbers.

Solid waste management in shambles in Bokaro

Cleanliness drive seems to have failed to leave a mark in Bokaro with several nooks and corners found choked with garbage and solid waste across the steel city Bokaro. Pick-up of garbage and waste is stopped for the past 45 days. City has a population over 6 lakhs, and Bokaro Steel Plant (BSL) management has the primary responsibility of cleaning the township area.

In the middle of the bad odour rising from the waste, the residents are forced to reside. We are finding a very hard time, said Poonam Sinha, a housewife and a resident of Sector 3. "The situation would become more frightening if the lifting of waste will not start soon," she added.

Another resident Vinod Kumar said, if the situation persists few more days the population may come in the grip of several diseases. "It is estimated that more than 3000 tonnes of garbage is lying in various sectors of the city in past one month, spreading bad smells as well as germs in our locality," added Kumar.

About 80 tonnes of garbage is increasing day-by-day which was getting dumped at different



areas, nooks and corners in the township areas. The Public Health Department of BSL in the township is responsible for the pickup and disposal of waste, an official said requesting anonymity. In the year 2017, BSL outsourced this work to M/S Utility Powertech Limited for one and a half years for Rs 6.5 crores and the company started a door-to-door collection of waste from various sectors and used to dump near Sector 11 in the landfill site, said the official.

After the successful completion of the work, the tender of this company was extended till 30 November 2019 and after that tender yet to be finalized and this work is being hampered. It resulted in increase in

FIRs against 37 named, 675 unidentified persons in Giridih

Giridih town police have registered four FIRs against 37 people, and 675 unidentified persons for incidents of violence that took place in Giridih on January 12. The incident took place just about 1.5 km from the town police station.

A total of five FIRs have been lodged, out of which four FIRs have been lodged in the town police station, while one FIR was lodged in Women's police station. The FIR (1/20) was lodged on Monday at Women's police station on a complaint by two minor girls namely Gullapa Praveen and

Reshma Praveen under Section 354, 354B, 509, 34 and 8/12 POCSO Act, police sources said.

Police said that the first case lodged on complaint by District president of VHP Rajesh Kumar Arya against Sair Ali Gadu, A. I. a. m., Sarbar, Raja A. I. a. m., G. u. r. a. n., S. o. n. o. Danis, Laddan Myrand Sarfaraz and 150, unnamed at Town police station. While the second FIR was lodged on Monday evening on a complaint by Shahinaz Ahmad at same police station against Jai Prakash Verma, former MLA of Gaudy, Kedhar Hazra of BJP, MLA of Jamua and others.

Police arrest 8 cyber criminals from Deoghar

Deoghar Cyber police conducted raid and arrested the prime suspect Gurudev Mandal at Kusma village under Khagra police station in Deoghar district in a cyber fraud case. Based on Mandal's confession and further interrogation, seven more cyber criminals were arrested from village Raghuvadih and Kusma.

The matter relates to Cyber Police Station case no 62/19, in which a victim Shubham Sandhya, medical student and resident of Deoghar was subjected to UPI fraud of Rs 50,000 after he received a fake call from a fraudster posing as manager of Bank of India. The arrested persons have been identified as Mijail Ansari, son of Khatir Ansari Gurudev Mandal son of Ramchandra Mandal, Bhim Mandal, son of Ranjit Mandal, Rakesh Mandal son of Ranjit Mandal all belonging to village Raghuvadih, while Vijay Mahato and Ajay Mahato both sons of Supari Mahato, Samir Mandal son of Anil Mandal and Ganesh Mandal son of Samir Mandal, resident of Kusma under Khagra, police station in Deoghar district.

Schools caution against touts in Jamshedpur

Parents being approached with admission lure

Schools in the city are warning parents to beware of touts this admission season. Leading English medium schools have said that they are receiving complaints of parents falling prey to rackets involved in admission lure.

Admission touts are not uncommon in the city, where most reputable schools receive a far greater number of applications than they can accommodate. According to information, touts look for preys and promise admission saying they know certain 'important' people in the school and they can get admission. They ask for money (any amount ranging from 1 lakh to 5 lakhs) to get the admission done through the back door.

"We have witnessed cases where they print notices on false letterheads (supposedly given by the school) giving information about interview dates, sale of books and uniform, orientation etc. These notices are forged and when parents go to the school for an interview or to buy books the school authorities deny them permission even to enter the school. Letters purportedly signed (forged) by the Principal, Secretary of the Managing Committee, bearing



the school stamp are given to the parents. Needless to say these are all fraud," said a school principal, who wished not to be quoted. She said that feeding on the despair of anxious parents to secure admission in a good school for their child, there are a few touts/middlemen/fraudsters who take advantage of the situation to make a quick buck.

In a few cases, the child gets into the admission list by pure luck. But the touts tell the parents that it is because of their intervention that they have got the admission. These innocent parents are happy that their money has secured them admission. This is absolutely not true. In a few rare cases the touts return the money (mostly it is not all only a part) to the parents after three or four months when they are not able to

secure admission for the child. Father Plus Fernandes, principal, Loyola School said that the parents need to be careful. All the schools in the city follow a standard procedure for admission and the parents should not get lured to the touts.

"Let me clear to the parents that no school takes money for admission. Therefore never ever give money to any middleman who promises admission. Even if he/she assures you that there is a 100 % chance of getting admission, do not believe him/her. All schools put up important information regarding admission on their school website. Therefore do not trust notices which do not have letterheads. Schools will not send notices through middlemen. Any notice will be given directly by the school office," said an official.
