Profile of Ambassador Garcetti:

Ambassador Garcetti was raised in the San Fernando Valley and earned his BA and MA from Columbia University. He studied as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford and the London School of Economics and taught at Occidental College and USC. He was an officer in the US Navy reserve for 12 years.

When he was elected as the Mayor of Los Angeles in 2013 - a post he held till 2022 - b he became the city's youngest mayor in 100 years. Before that, he served as President of the Los Angeles City Council from 2006 to 2012, and as a Councilmember of the 13th District before that.

He is an avid jazz pianist and photographer. He and his wife Amy Elaine Wakeland has a daughter.
